

- Offer outreach and engagement programming


# Collaborative inquiry with Indigenous legal traditions

Through our teaching and scholarship in Indigenous legal traditions, we aim to build and strengthen relationships with local First Nations based on trust, respect, reciprocity, consent and accountability, in order to support and amplify Indigenous voices and aspirations.
